Riding the Bus

If you have never ridden the bus or not used one recently, here's a quick and easy lesson. After checking the bus schedule of the route you want to use, go to the closest bus stop. Most River Valley Transit stop locations are marked by a bus stop sign. Remember, buses stop only at designated bus stops.

WHICH ONE'S MY BUS? Look at the headsign on the front of the bus to determine the destination.

- As the bus comes, stand close to the bus stop and signal to the driver.
- Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop and then board at the front door of the bus. Please have your exact change, token or pass ready to show the driver as you enter the bus.
- If you need to transfer to another RIVER VALLEY TRANSIT bus to complete your one-way trip, ask the driver for a transfer when you board.
- Take a seat and enjoy your ride.

DE-BOARDING:

- Shortly after the bus passes the stop before yours, pull the cord or press the Touch Tape. A "Stop Requested" light and/or a bell at the front of the bus will let the driver know you want to de-board.
- Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop, and then exit from the bus.

FAREBOXES: The fareboxes accept EZ Fare passes, coins (no pennies please), tokens and bills (one, five, ten, twenty dollar bills only). The farebox will "beep" to tell you and the driver that the correct fare has been paid. Let the driver know if you are purchasing an EZ Pass before putting money in the fare box .

ACCESSIBLE SERVICE: River Valley Transit's active fleet is 100% accessible to persons with disabilities. RVT buses with the low floor design provides easy access entry to all passengers by eliminating the steps at the entrance and exit doors.

Bus Fares

Our EZ Fare passes are the most convenient way to pay to ride the bus. Instead of using cash or tokens, simply purchase one of our EZ Fare Passes and use it like a prepaid credit card when boarding the bus. Compare EZ Fares to standard fares:

EZ FARE PASS INFORMATION

- One-Day Pass good for unlimited rides during one calendar day.
- 2-Ride Pass good for 2 rides*
- **7-Day Pass** good for unlimited rides during a consecutive seven-day period.
- 10-Ride Pass good for 10 rides*
- 20-Ride Pass good for 20 rides*
- **31-Day Pass** good for unlimited rides during a consecutive thirtyone day period.

There are no refunds for any EZ Fare Pass. This includes lost, damaged, or stolen passes. *Valid for one year after initial use.

TOKEN INFORMATION:

Tokens, 3 for \$5.00, may be purchased at:

- Trade & Transit Centre Information Office
- River Valley Transit Administrative Office

TRANSFERS:

- Transfers are free. (for multi-ride passes & single fare only)
- Ask operator for transfer immediately upon boarding and deposit exact fare.
- For use only in a continuous direction.
- Not good for a return trip on the same route.
- Good only for the next available bus, not to exceed one (1) hour.

CHILDREN: Children under the age of six ride free when accompanied by a fare-paying adult. School trips excluded.

YOUTHS: Youths (17 and under) ride at the discounted price of \$1.00 year round. A 3-Month Youth Pass is also available at a highly discounted price.



corresponds to the numbered columns in the timetable section of the schedule.

Times listed in the columns give the time when the bus is schedule to leave that time point. If you are at a stop which is located between time points, the bus will arrive after the time shown for the previous time point, but before the time shown for the next time point. Time points are numbered in the direction the bus runs along the route.

Reading the Guide and Planning a Trip

Look at the diagram map and locate the time point right before your stop. The number of this time point on the map

Use the following steps to see how easy it is to read the schedule.

- Locate where you are and where you want to go. Let's assume you are the Clinton County Community Center and want to go to Walmart.
- 2 On the map, locate the timed stop closest to your current location. In this example it is stop 3.
- 3 Read down the column for stop 3 to find the time closest to the time you would like to depart.
- 4 To find the arrive time at your destination, read across the timetable row. In this instance if you depart the Community Center at 2:15 pm you would arrive at Walmart at 2:30 pm.
