Why Geography Changes the Planning Approach

Call **1-888-524-9306** California generates well over a million cruise passengers annually, and the Northeast — spanning New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, and surrounding affluent suburbs — represents one of the densest concentrations of long-haul, high-intent travelers in the country. Both regions skew toward Viking's core demographic: travelers who want a culturally rich, destination-focused trip rather than a high-volume resort cruise. California travelers are flying the longest distance to reach most Viking departure cities.
